CORRESPONDENCE

Keith and Paddy Murray have resigned from the Committee and Keith also as our representative on the Search and Rescue Organisation. We sincerely thank them for all their past efforts on behalf of the Club, and assure them that we will miss their presence on the Committee.

Mr J. Ros Garnett, Secretary of the National Parks and National Monuments Standing Committee wrote to advise us that a conference of delegates from interested organisations will be held late in August. The main purpose of the conference is to consider (1) legislation (National Parks) which is about to be presented to Parliament, and (2) the constitution of the conference and its Standing Committee. At our last general meeting the club elected Norm Richards as our delegate to this conference.

One of the resolutions to be put before the conference allows for interested individuals to become associate members of what it is hoped will be known as the Victorian National Parks Association, on the payment of 5/- per annum subscription. We therefore hope that all who wish to help in the preservation of our national parks, (and as Bushwalkers we should all have an interest in this matter), will start saving now to become associate members.

MORE FINANCE

At our last Committee meeting it was decided to increase the room Collection on Friday nights from 6d to 1/-. When the Collection was originated, it was designed to cover the cost of renting our meeting room, together with supper. For a considerable time the amount asked has remained at a low figure, while the rent charged has steadily risen, being further increased only this month, so that the Collection of late has barely covered three quarters of the rent, and on some occasions forms only half the cost of the rent.

When we consider that, as far as I know, no other Walking Club in Melbourne asks less than 1/- as Collection, and at least one club with a large weekly attendance asks 2/- each meeting, most of us will feel that such a good night's entertainment can be considered to be worth considerably more than the 1/- asked. Where else indeed can we obtain an evening's entertainment with supper for 1/-?

Please don't forget the "Honesty Box" on the door if you are obliged to leave before the Collection is taken up at 9 p.m., or if somehow you are missed by the person collecting.

CHRISTMAS WALKS

The lecturette last month took the form of a discussion on Christmas walks for 1952, during which a rough plan was evolved. There is now a chart on the Notice Board indicating the areas in which most interest was shown. Members are asked to put their names down as soon as possible for any walk they are interested in, even though they may not be quite sure yet whether they can go. They may include their names on more than one list. The following are the areas at present most popular:

1. Buller - St Bernard - Licola - Wellington

2. Kosciusko area

3. Bogong area

4. Tasmania

5. Canberra - Tumut - Yarrongobilly Caves area

The greatest interest to date seems to be in the fourth and first named.

Meetings will shortly be held for those interested in a particular area to go into greater details, and to elect leaders.

Of two walks suggested in the number 1 area,

(a) Licola - Mt McDonald - Howitt - Cobbler - Buller, and

(b) Castleburn - Mt Kent - Moroka Track - Snowy Plains - Speculation - Selwyn - St Bernard,

Norm Richards has expressed his willingness to lead the second, and Edna Richards would be willing to lead a walk in the Kosciusko area.

The chart will appear on the Notice Board for two more Friday nights only. As well as for particular areas, provision is made for members to indicate on the chart for what period they will be available over Christmas.

Although it may seem early in the year, experience has shown that details should be finalised as early as possible, and members who are interested should try to make an early decision as to what walk they will choose for Christmas.

We should remind intending Christmas walkers to start stocking up well in advance, and making all gear, including first aid kit, complete and in good repair. They should allow for taking away with them ample extra pocket money in case, as sometimes happens, extra expense is incurred through getting lost or returning late, as, according to the indemnity clause in the Constitution, members are themselves responsible for any such extra expense.

CHRISTMAS CARDS

This year Frank Pitt will be handling the production and sales of Christmas cards. It is hoped to have them on sale by the end of September, so that those who wish to do so will have ample time to post cards overseas. This year's card will feature a photo, the block being taken from one of the issues of "Walk".

ALONG THE TRACK

WALLAN - MT DISAPPOINTMENT - TOMMY'S HUT - JACK SMITH - 19/20th July.

Thirteen walkers turned out in perfect weather, only marred by the herring carried by Les Scott. By the end of the walk it was decided to call Tommy's Hut "Dead Fish Hut". Edna Richards celebrated her birthday on Mt Disappointment. We wonder whether the fish was to give atmosphere. Going was fairly easy, and a variety of fairly heavily timbered hills was climbed. We waited for some time for Felix's party, but eventually decided to head for home without them and notify the contact that they had not appeared.

MASON'S FALLS AREA - TOMMY'S HUT - FELIX HARDING - 20th July.

There were eighteen on this walk. From Howatt's Lookout we had a beautifully clear view of the Yan Yean Reservoir. Two New Zealand visitors saw some wild wallabies for the first time, as we headed towards Sugarloaf. We had lunch at the bottom of Mason's Gorge (and what a gorge we had), then climbed the steep side. Nicky Goro took the Kiwis for a trip to Sugarloaf while the rest plodded on to the Falls. There was plenty of water coming over, and the sight was worth seeing. It was becoming dusk as we started out to follow the over-grown timber-track to Tommy's Hut. Somewhere along this track we lost ourselves. We later estimated that at 6 p.m. we were only $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the main road and the van. We decided to steer directly for Tommy's Hut by compass, and plunged through dense undergrowth. We took two hours to reach the road. When we reached Tommy's Hut at about 8 p.m., we found the van had gone, so chartered a local bus back to Melbourne, arriving back in Melbourne each with 12/- less than we had anticipated.

RESERVOIR - AQUEDUCT - GREENSBOROUGH - TOM STOODLEY - 27th July.

The last walk for the Winter Walks Program was held in lovely weather. Seventeen attended. We followed the road from Reservoir to the Aqueduct, then followed the course of the Aqueduct, stopping for lunch just after crossing the Plenty Road. Lunch was followed by a good bask in the sun. We then crossed a bridge and passed some beehives (no one being stung), and arrived in Greensborough in leisurely fashion, ahead of schedule.
