#### LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

In the leading article in The News, January 1991, one person tells us what his idea of a bushwalk is and tries to convince us his is the only way to enjoy one.

The authoritarian tone of the article, its first paragraph references to the (capital L) Leader, its Star Chamber-like threats of sanctions by mostly anonymous "senior leaders" against hinted at but never named transgressors leave a nasty aftertaste. I had not believed that there were here people arrogant enough to prescribe to others how they should enjoy their Sunday bushwalk, nor do I imagine many bushwalkers are sufficiently sheeplike to allow others to prescribe the manner of their enjoyment.

Despite the above, my experience of our walk leaders has been quite different. Our leaders are reasonable people who will agree that our liberty to enjoy our Sunday walks in our individual ways must not be limited except by discouraging any one's behaviour that compromises either the safety or the enjoyment of others on the walk. The walkers who are also reasonable will surely concur on what constitutes such behaviour. The only remaining problem is that of the necessary two-way communication and agreement between the leader and those s/he shares the walk with.

As far as "tearaways" are concerned, this two-way communication must include a clear understanding of where those in front should stop and wait for the rest of the group. If the leader is familiar with the walk, reaching such an understanding should present no difficulty. Only if those up front were to breach such an understanding would the leader have cause for complaint.

In the matter of "unwritten" and "written" (engraved on stone tablets, yet?) laws, please, for sanity's sake, as few as are strictly necessary. Or was anyone thinking of adopting as a start the traditional Middle East half step between the superior Leader and the inferior follower?

Abundant bird and animal life includes wedge-tailed eagles, lyrebirds, rosellas, wombats, echidnas, bandicoots and platypus. You may even hear the world's largest worm gurgling beneath your feet. The walk also includes panoramic views of the green rolling hills of the LaTrobe Valley.

It is advised that you carry wet-weather gear and water. An end of walk treat of scones and tea/coffee will be provided by the ranger's children for a small fee.

The beautiful Lake Tali Karng hidden in the mountains, undiscovered even by the aborigines until last century is one of the most popular bushwalking destinations. We will visit it the weekend just after Easter, so there may be fewer people around than usual

I plan to start at McFarlane's Saddle, which involves a car shuffle but it gives a varied walk mainly downhill We will camp above the lake, and after pitching tents we can do a short walk to the Sentinels for a view down to the lake - bring a small day pack. Next morning we will go down to Tali Karng and then along the Wellington River (about 16 river crossings). If there is time, we will visit Croll's Gorge.

# 12-14 APRIL SQUARE HEAD JINNY - MT HOWITT MEDIUM/HARD

Doug will lead a pack-carrying trip, reaching camp by lunchtime, Thursday. That afternoon and Friday morning will be spent with day packs exploring the Plateau, returning to base camp Friday late afternoon. This trip will be suitable for beginners in pack-carrying.

#### THE END OF THE TRACK

Paddy Pallin died in Sydney on 3rd January 1991 aged 90.

Paddy Pallin came to Australia in 1926. In 1930 he and his wife made an adventurous canoe trip down the Shoalhaven River from Long Point Lookout, Tallong to Bomaderry Creek, Nowra. When he returned to his office after the trip he found that he was another victim of the Great Depression.

He started a back bedroom industry, using a household treadle sewing machine to make tents, packs and other gear for bushwalkers and scouts. Today there are Paddy Pallin shops in Melbourne, Box Hill, Sydney, Canberra, Jindabyne (NSW) and Carringbah (NSW).

Paddy was President and Secretary of The Federation of Bushwalking Clubs in NSW for many years. In 1934 he became the first organiser of Search and Rescue for the Federation in NSW. He retired from this position in 1976 after 42 years service. Paddy was active with scouts and helped found the Youth Hostels Association in NSW.

At 54 Paddy learnt to ski across the snowfields at Kiandra. He helped with the alterations of a building which became the YHA hostel in Kiandra. Then in 1958 he helped with the building of the new YHA hostel in Thredbo. In 1965 he organised the Paddy Pallin Ski Classic from Round Mountain (near Kiandra) to Perisher (near Threadbo).

Paddy led many Easter bushwalking trips in the Budawangs before this area became a National Park. He was still bushwalking in 1987.

I still use a Paddy Made pack on Lilo trips, a Paddy Made tent on base camps and my Paddy Made water bucket, billies and Paddy fingers go on all my trips. We'll miss you Paddy.
