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HALF-YEARLY MEETING

Members are reminded of the half-yearly meeting which is on 27th August.

At this meeting the proposed amendment to the constitution, of which notice was given in the April-May issue of News, will be discussed. It concerns section 5 MEMBERSHIP (a) (i) and proposes the amendment of "one Club program week-end walk" to read "two Club program week-end walks".

EXTRAORDINARY GENERAL MEETING

A petition has been received from 18 members of the club requesting an Extraordinary General Meeting to discuss the following proposed constitutional amendments:

Amendment 1 : That a new provision (i) be added to Section 8 providing: "The Honorary Walks Secretary shall have power to veto Committee decisions and direct such decisions to a General Meeting."

Amendment 2 : That the first part of Section 7 be amended to read: "That the office bearers shall consist of a President, Vice-President, Honorary Walks Secretary, Honorary Treasurer, Honorary Secretary, Honorary Social Secretary and "News" Convenor."

Amendment 3 : That Section 8 (a) be amended to read: "The Committee shall consist of all office bearers."

Amendment 4 : That Section 8 (b) be amended to provide that five members shall constitute a quorum by inserting the word "five" for the figure now mentioned.

Amendment 5 : That the last two sentences in Section 8 (d) be amended to read: "The Committee is empowered to form such sub-committees as may be necessary. the Committee or Convenors of sub-committees may co-opt any person whose assistance may be deemed valuable."

Amendment 6 : That in Section 12 (a) "Honorary Walks Secretary" be inserted after "Honorary Secretary".

Amendments 1 and 6 are designed to increase the power and standing of the Walks Secretary.

Amendments 2, 3, 4 and 5 are concerned with streamlining the Committee and bringing it closer to the membership.

This meeting will be held on 17th September at 8.30 pm in the clubroom.

AMENDMENTS TO THE BY-LAWS

The Committee has made the following amendments to the By-Laws:

1. Section (E) BOOKING OFFICER and other relevant sections of the By-Laws will be deleted as from the beginning of the next Walks Programme. This means that loaders will be responsible for canvassing for their walks as before.
2. SECRETARIAL, Paragraph 6 has been deleted. Paragraph 5 has become Paragraph 1 under a new sub-heading SPECIAL MEETINGS.
3. Under the new sub-heading SPECIAL MEETINGS, there is a new By-Law, Paragraph 2, which reads: "Any two or more Committee members may, if they consider the circumstances warrant it, request the Secretary to call a special meeting of the Committee by giving the reason and at least seven days' notice to the members of the Committee."

SNOW TRIP: Mt. Hotham - Mt. Feathertop, 31 July-1 August

Four cars left Melbourne on Friday night bound for Harrietville, but only three arrived, the generator on Bill's Landrover having blown up at Euroa and effectively kept himself and two others off the trip. Next morning, in perfect sunny weather, the climbing party of four, equipped with ice axes and ropes, started off up the Bungalow Spur to attack Feathertop from this direction, and two cars containing the nine would-be ski tourers departed for Hotham. On arrival at the Diamantina Hut we met two skiers, with whom it was discovered one of our party had gone to school six years ago, and whom our Canadian friend had also met in Y.H.A.

It was late morning before we actually strapped on our skis and set off. As befitted the leader's position, he was the first away, sailing gracefully down the slope to the Razorback, his skis getting further apart as he went, till with a smothered curse he pitched into the snow. He was not the only one to fall at this particular spot; three or four others managed the same feat. Soon we were laboriously sidestepping up the narrow ridge, to find at the top that the descent was too steep to ski straight down, and that the ridge was too narrow to permit traversing from side to side, so once more we side-stepped down the ridge, and then side-stepped up the other side. Not so our Canadian friend, Ed, with his proper Langlauf equipment - he was soon miles ahead of us and not exerting himself half as much. During the afternoon we descended until we were below the tree line. Here it was decided that trees and skis do not mix - it was impossible to get even the shortest of runs, and many were the people who bashed their shins against trees. It was sidestep, sidestep, sidestep all the time. So we camped only about three miles along the Razorback. A number of people retired to their tents and cooked tea there, whilst the hardier members of the party scraped away 18 inches of snow and lit a fire.

After a very quiet night it took a lot of prodding to get people out of their warm sleeping bags, and by 9.30 am the last were on their way. It had been deemed wiser to turn back; we were not even half way along the Razorback, and it had taken six hours to get this far, so, much as we would have liked to go on, we made our way back to Hotham under a sky rapidly filling with clouds. This time, rather than going over all the peaks and bumps, we sidled them and made much faster time, arriving back in 3½ hours, there to find Bill and his two mates whiling away the time before leaving for Melbourne. There was even time left for some members to have an hour's skiing on Hotham slopes, others preferring to watch from the comfortable lounge of Hotham Heights Chalet whilst quaffing suitable refreshments. So we eventually left and drove back to Harrietville, where, in the deepening gloom, four figures finally materialised into the victorious climbing party. Packs were piled into the boot and we headed off for Melbourne after a very enjoyable week-end.
