NOV 12 (SAT) HISTORICAL WALK - PORT MELDOURNE

EASY.

Meet under the clocks in time to catch 2.13 train to Port Melbourne. We will be travelling on the oldest (from 1854) line to one of the first sites of settlement.

Returning (probably by bus) about 5pm.

NOV 13 DROPMORE - HUGHES CREEK - CASCADES WALK SASY AND MED.

LEADER: JOPIE BODEGRAVEN

TRANSFORT: VAN FROM BATMAN AVE, 9AM.

MAP REFERENCE: YEA 1:50,000

This is another of those areas with creeks, cascades open rolling hills, good views and interesting rock formations. There will be an easy and a medium walk. Dothe start by following Doundary Creek upstream past 2km of cascades and interesting creek walking up to a good lookout hill 200m above the start. The easy group continues via farmland, a second lower but very lovely viewing hill and cascades on Hughes Creek back to the van. The medium

group will do all this but also climb up Mt. Tickatory to be rewarded by views in all directions and great granite slabs and outcrops, for the price of an extra 3km and 200m of climbing. Total distance and climbs are - easy 12km and 300m climb - medium 15km and 500m climb. The easy can be further shortened for anyone who wants an even easier walk down to 8km and 200m climb if need be.

NOV 27 LORNE WATERFALLS EASY AND MEDIUM

LEADER: PHIL LARKIN

SUB LEADER: JAN Llewellyen

TRANSPORT:: VAN FROM BATMAN AVE, 9AM.

MAP REF: 1:25,000 LORNE VIC MAP LORNE FOREST COMMISSION.

APPROXIMATE DISTANCE: 15KM.

This area is notable for its sheer beauty and scenic coast and peaceful forest reserves. It offers a natural forest backdrop to the ocean and includes several swiftly flowing seaward streams. These offer numerous and spectacular waterfalls, cascades and rapids. The walking tracks which follow approximately 24kms of historic timber tramway routes and windes through fern gullies, gorges and many places traversing cliff faces. There is also abundance of fauna such as the echidna platypus, possums and gliders which are all common on the Otway Ranges. Also at this time of year there is abundance of wild flowers in bloom. medium walk starts from the ocean road following the Sheoak Creek up stream to Sheoak picnic ground for lunch. The easy group will start from the Sheoak picnic ground. Then both groups will visit the Won Wondah, Henderson and Phantom Falls and including the Cannon in this section. After leaving the Phantom Falls the walk will follow the Cora Lynn track to the cascades to finish the walk on the Erskine road above the cascades. So bring along your cameras, bathers for an enjoyable day. Do not forget to bring water.

WEEKEND WALKS

NOV 11-13 STANLEY NAME SPUR - MT. HOWITT - MT, MAGDALA - HELICOPTER SPUR. MED/HARD.

EXPECTED TIME OF RETURN: 9.00pm (to Melb).

MAP REF: V.M.T.C. 1:70,000 KING HOWQUIT AND JAMIESON WATERSHEDS; NATMAP 1:100,000 HOWITT.

APPROXIMATE DISTANCE: 23KM.

The Mt. Howitt area is one of the most spectacular in the Victorian Alps, with jagged ridges and razorbacks, alpine pastures and huge cliff faces. On Friday night we will camp at the base of Howitt Spur. On Saturday we will climb to the top of the Crosscut Saw by way of the Queen Spur Road and then Stanley Name Spur. Then we shall follow the main divide across Mt. Howitt to camp near Mt. Magdala. Sunday will see us climb Magdala and King Eilly and descend by Helicopter Spur to the Howqua River and cars.

Please come prepared for possible foul weather, and please bring boots as there may still be some snow cover around.

POWELLTOWN - SEVENACRE ROCK - DUNYIP RIVER

Camped Friday night at Sheepyard Flat. Saturday morning drove us as far as old hut site below the Bluff. A carpark now exists a few hundred meteres further up the road at the bottom of the walking track. Climbed the bluff on foot. Plenty of snow on the top but conditions poor with no visibility, wind etc. Snow wet and slow. Made camp at midday in a sheltered spot near the Blowhole. Plenty of show and very good slopes in this area. In the afternoon skied to Bluff Hut, being there entertained by Graeme Storey and John Brewster. They have improved the condition of the hut enormously in order to entertain parties, including provision of a comfortable new refuge section. Their style of operation appears to be entirely in accord with the character of the area.

Sunday morning conditions were no better than before with rather more wind and cold bits of wet snow. Made a late start and retraced steps over the Bluff to cars. Sking is potentially very good in this area but needs better weather. Pearson Cresswell.

The Federation Of Victorian Walking clubs will have a stand, and are seeking volunteers to staff it, answering the public's questions about bushwalking. We may also be able to sell MALK.  - 4 A proposed State Conservation Strategy for Victoria has been published. Comments are requested from organizations such as ours& interested individuals. Athol is prepared to chair a subcommittee to draw up a submission from the club, but as yet we have no other volunteers. Please help!!
 - A report on the management of huts on public land is now being considered by the Minister for Conservation, Forests and Lands. Among the working party's recommendations are that in most cases huts should be available for use by the public on a first come, first served basis. where the public includes commercial tour operators. They also suggest that a possible solution for the growing demand for commercial tours on public land could be a combination of existing developed areas, freehold land, and strategically placed facilities on public land to provide a basic network of hostel and chalet type accommodation. Copies of the report are available from the Forests Commission, but the club has a summary of the recommendations. Comments on the recommendations can be sent to the Minister.
